Oregon and Washington Vaccine Updates

Construction Workers are Now Eligible for Vaccines in Oregon

As of April 5, 2021, those in our industry are considered frontline workers (Group 7) by the CDC. Anyone who is interested in getting the vaccine is now eligible!

On May 1, all Oregonians 16 and older will be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

Construction Workers Are Now Eligible For Vaccines in Washington

The next two tiers of those eligible for the vaccine have now opened up in Washington. Appointments are now open for:

- Additional workers in congregate settings (restaurants, manufacturing, construction)
- Anyone with two or more comorbidities
- Anyone between the ages of 60 and 64
- Anyone living in congregate settings (correctional facilities, group homes for those with disabilities, those experiencing homelessness, etc.)
