## SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT

## FOR INTERNATIONAL BROTHERHOOD OF ELECTRICAL WORKERS DISTRICT NO. 9 PENSION PLAN

This is a summary of the annual report for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers District No. 9 Pension Plan, E.I.N. 93-6074829, Plan No. 001, for the year ended March 31, 2019. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

## **Basic Financial Statement**

Benefits under the plan are provided through a trust fund and insurance. Plan expenses were \$54,615,477. These expenses included \$1,292,800 in administrative expenses and \$53,322,677 in benefits paid to or for participants and beneficiaries. A total 26,258 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the plan at the end of the plan year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$1,371,961,786 as of March 31, 2019, compared to \$1,291,942,558 as of April 1, 2018. During the plan year the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$80,019,228. This increase includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year, or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$134,634,705 including employer contributions of \$87,376,796, rollovers of \$1,635,513 and earnings from investments of \$45,622,396.

- 5. assets held for investment.

The charges to cover copying costs given above do not include charges for the copying of these portions of the reports because these portions are furnished without charge.
